The Yoruba Global One Thousand presents its compliments to the Secretary-General of the United Nations and has the honour to transmit, herewith, a communication expressing grave concern regarding the recent public denial of ongoing mass atrocities in Nigeria by African Union Chair Mahmoud Ali Youssouf.

The Organization respectfully notifies the Secretary-General that this statement, which negates the lived experiences of millions across West Africa, has resulted in a formal withdrawal of confidence in the Chair's capacity to represent victims of conflict, cultural repression, and systemic displacement.

YG1K further informs the Secretary-General that it represents a global population of over sixty million Yoruba citizens and descendants, whose collective realities reflect the violence and institutional failures being dismissed. The Organization therefore requests the engagement of the Secretary-General's office in preventing institutional erasure, safeguarding civic dignity, and facilitating credible multilateral responses to unfolding conditions reminiscent of pre-genocide warning patterns elsewhere on the continent.

The Yoruba Global One Thousand avails itself of this occasion to convey, through this Note Verbale, that a substantive letter and accompanying documentation — including the Organization's recommended response mechanism titled the Fulani Resettlement Initiative — will follow for the attention of the Secretary-General and relevant organs of the United Nations system.

The Yoruba Global One Thousand renews to the Secretary-General of the United Nations the assurances of its highest consideration.

Subject: Nigeria's Escalating Crisis, Diaspora Collapse Pressures, and Introduction of the YG1K Fulani Resettlement Initiative (Attachment)

Your Excellency,

We write again in continuation of our earlier correspondence because Nigeria is entering a critical terminal phase whose consequences now extend far beyond its boundaries. What once appeared as domestic instability has matured into an international crime scene, generating global insecurity, human flight, economic extraction, and demographic displacement at scale. This collapse is directly responsible for a second slavery — a mass brain drain forcing millions into precarious survival across foreign economies, while maintaining two homes in two nations yet enjoying safety in neither.

This is the lived experience of over 60 million Yoruba worldwide — a civilizational people of excellence, now compelled to build the world but unable to secure a future for their own.

1. The Global Implications of Multilateral Failure

The Nigerian crisis exposes systemic failures of:

ineffective multilateral institutions

geopolitical hesitation

policy inertia

collusion with extractive globalist interests

These failures have produced cascading insecurity — the forced migration of Africa's intellectual class — weakening both origin states and global stability.

Your Excellency, Nigeria has become a net exporter of suffering and dependency because the world refused early leadership.

2. YG1K Offers a Fully-Situated Perspective — "The Blind Men and The Elephant"

At our inaugural press briefing, we invoked the tale of four blind people describing an elephant, each believing their limited contact was the entire truth.

This analogy remains instructive:

Western actors see only terrorism

NGOs see humanitarian symptoms

Only YG1K — representing the world's largest Yoruba demographic inside and outside Nigeria — sees the whole elephant:

Executive Briefing for Diplomatic Circulation

1. Context and Rationale

Persistent insecurity across West Africa is significantly aggravated by:

Stateless militant nomadic movement

Unregulated settlement expansion

Weak territorial governance

Weapon proliferation and unpoliced migration corridors

Attempts to "disarm militants" without legal jurisdiction or defined enforcement structure have been ineffective and, in many cases, escalatory.

Under present conditions, expecting state institutions to enforce disarmament is infeasible and endangers civilians.

The YG1K Fulani Resettlement Initiative (FRI) offers a lawful, humane, internationally supervised alternative to perpetual confrontation.

2. Core Objective

To establish structured, voluntary, internationally monitored resettlement and integration zones that:

Protect indigenous land rights

Respect Fulani civilian dignity

Separate violent actors from peaceful populations

Stabilize contested territories

Reduce interstate and interethnic conflict risk

3. Guiding Principles

The FRI operates under:

International humanitarian law

Self-determination frameworks

Rights-preserving transitional security doctrines

Non-punitive conflict de-escalation models

The initiative does not target Fulani identity, but addresses the structural conditions that weaponize mobility and statelessness.
